Southern Idaho Fast Facts

Location

Located in south-central Idaho, the mighty Snake River and its magnificent canyon etch the boundary of the cities of Jerome and Twin Falls. Near-by communities Burley and Rupert are surrounded by the Snake River and beautiful Cache Peak. Boise, the state capital, is about a 1.5-hour drive northwest; Northern Nevada is less than 1 hour to the south and Salt Lake City Utah is approximately 3 hours southeast.

The topographic, geographic location, and seasonal variations make the region prime for all things food: agriculture, agri-business, food processing and related and supporting services like warehousing and transportation. Southern Idaho was designated a key U.S. Manufacturing Community – All Things Food in 2015.

Other key sectors in the region include food and beverage, plastics, and green energy – the region is one of the few in the U.S. to generate energy in all five renewable sectors: hydro, wind, solar, biomass, and geothermal.

Eight counties make up the "Magic Valley" region of Southern Idaho. Twin Falls is the hub of the region with a population of nearly 53,000. Twin Falls accounts for 48.4% of regional jobs.
